BEWARE!!

Zaza Red (Tianepine) - AKA Gas Station Heroin Marketed as a dietary supplement

It isn't as potent as heroin, but many people are buying it at the local gas station and using it so they can manage or maintain their opioid consumption because of its addictive nature. It's also opening new avenues of abuse for those who may not have a history of opioid addiction."

Tianeptine works similarly to an opioid because it hits opioid receptors in the brain, causing an increase in dependency and severe withdrawal symptoms if you stop using it. Withdrawal symptoms include stomach pains, fever, chills, vomiting, diarrhea, runny nose, and watery eyes.

It's like having the worst version of the flu. It's very uncomfortable, so many fall into this cycle of withdrawal and addiction to avoid getting sick. You keep taking more to achieve the same response.

Overuse has led to many hospitalizations and even deaths. In most cases, the deaths are due to respiratory depression, when your breathing slows to the point you stop breathing altogether.
